Wool Incentive Payments Set At 43.2 Percent Of Sale

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Federal Government has set wool incentive payments to producers for their 1959 crop at 43.2 percent of the dollar return they received from sale of the wool on the open market.

The incentive payment program is designed to encourage domestic production of wool. Short wool production in the United States last year totaled 27,200,000 pounds. The incentive payments from tariff duties on imported wool.

The incentive payments are set at 43.2 percent of the net return to the producer. The average of 43.2 percent is based on the 1959 marketing year—April 1 through March 31, 1960—when the wool price was 183 cents per pound. This was 39 cent above the year's earlier price.

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Beatniks are urged to give peyote back to the Indians.
